Our vision: is of a world in which all children realize their full potential, in societies that respect people's rights and dignity.

#### **Our Mission:**

Plan strives to achieve lasting improvements in the quality of life of deprived children in developing countries, through a process that unites people across cultures and adds meaning and value to their lives.

- A 76 years old organization working on issues of children in both development and humanitarian context
- Currently working in 72 countries across the world.
- Annual budget around1.2 billion USD
- 10,000 staff across the world

# Plan International Ethiopia started operation in Ethiopia in 1995

- Currently working with partners, communities / organizations
- In 5 Program Regions
- Addis Ababa Administrative rejoins In 10 sub cities;
- Amhara Rejoin in 1997;
- SNNPR in 2003
- Oromia in 2006; &
- Gambella in 2014





# **Thematic Country Programs**

- 1. Protection of Children from Violence (PCV).
- 2. Early Survival and Development of Children (ESDeC) includes WASH, Health & Nutrition & Economic Security)
- 3. A Better Childhood Development and Education for All (ABCDE for All)
- 4. Emergency Response and DRM.



# **WASH Concerns in Ethiopia**

- 1. Access to safe drinking water supply is low( currently 57%: urban 93% and rural 49%):JMP-Joint Monitoring Program WHO and UNICEF.
- Access to sanitation is low( currently 71%, only 28% is improved: urban 94%(27% improved) and rural 66% (28% improved): JMP-Joint Monitoring Program WHO and UNICEF.



## **WASH Intervention of Plan**

- 1. Creating access to safe drinking water Supply and Sanitary facilities to communities and institutions.
- 2. Sanitation and Hygiene (S&H) to communities and institutions.



# How we do our programs

- 1. Access to clean drinking water
- Community Managed Project Approach is where the community takes the initiative in planning, implementation, operation and maintenance –sustainability ( adopted from Ethiopian Government's COWASH Project).
- Integrated Approach where Multiple Use Services(MUS), Food Security, Nutrition, Village Saving and Loan Association (VSLA), Menstrual Hygiene Management(MHM) etc.



# How we do our programs...

- 2. Sanitation and Hygiene
- Use Community Led Total Sanitation and Hygiene (CLTSH)
   Approach.
- CLTSH is a participatory approach with very low cost (US\$

   0.73 per person to become ODF).
- Initiates communities to analyze their hygiene and sanitation situation, construct and use latrines and hand washing facilities.
- Builds capacity of the community to be on driver seat

## What have we achieved

#### 1.Water Supply

- Supported construction of 221 safe water supply schemes benefitting 235,783 people including children.
- Strengthened capacity of 221 Village Water and Sanitation Committees to promote sustainability.
- Constructed institutional latrines for 90 schools and health centers.



#### 2. Sanitation and Hygiene

- Effectively piloted and implemented Community Led Total Sanitation and Hygiene (CLTSH) Approach since 2007.
- Contributed to include CLTSH within the national plan of Ethiopian Government (SAP) .
- Enabled 896 kebeles (the smallest administrative Unit) to be Open Defecation Free (ODF) benefitting 6 million people including children, schools and health institutions.
- Introduced sanitation marketing to promote sustainability.
- Conducted two CLTS researches- ODF Sustainability and Testing CLTSH approaches.

- Hygiene and sanitation promotion has to be supplemented with sanitation marketing.




# What Next- the way forward
