

- Staff 44 officers in 8 field offices








PART 3: 2015/6 Drought: Emergency WASH Response





- **WASH Sector Needs:**
- 7.5 million People in 6 Regions-211 **Districts**
- Financial Requirement US \$73.5 mill
- **Response Strategy**
- Reduce non functionality rates
- Develop new resilient supply systems
- Address Hygiene and sanitation related issues




Three Phase approach: Combined remote sensing and hydrogeological investigation methods in Afar Region








Location of Study Area
